**MAGIC RAISIN SCONES**

Mix and sift into bowl, 1 1/2 c. once-sifted pastry flour (or 1 1/4 c. once-sifted hard-wheat flour), 3 tps. Magic Baking Powder, 1/2 tsp. salt. Cut in finely 4 lb. chilled shortening and mix in 1/4 c. washed and dried raisins and 1/4 c. lightly-packed brown sugar. Combine 1 slightly-beaten egg, 1/4 c. milk and a few drops almond favoring. Make a well in dry ingredients and add liquids; mix lightly with fork, adding milk if necessary, to make a soft dough. Knead for 10 seconds on a lightly-floured board and pat out into greased pie plate (7 1/2" top inside measure) and mark into 6 pie-shaped wedges. Bake in hot oven, 425°, about 18 minutes. Serve hot with butter or margarine. Yield—6 scones.

—The monthly meeting of the Searlettown W. I. was held at the home of Mrs. Fred MacQuarrie on Oct. 6.

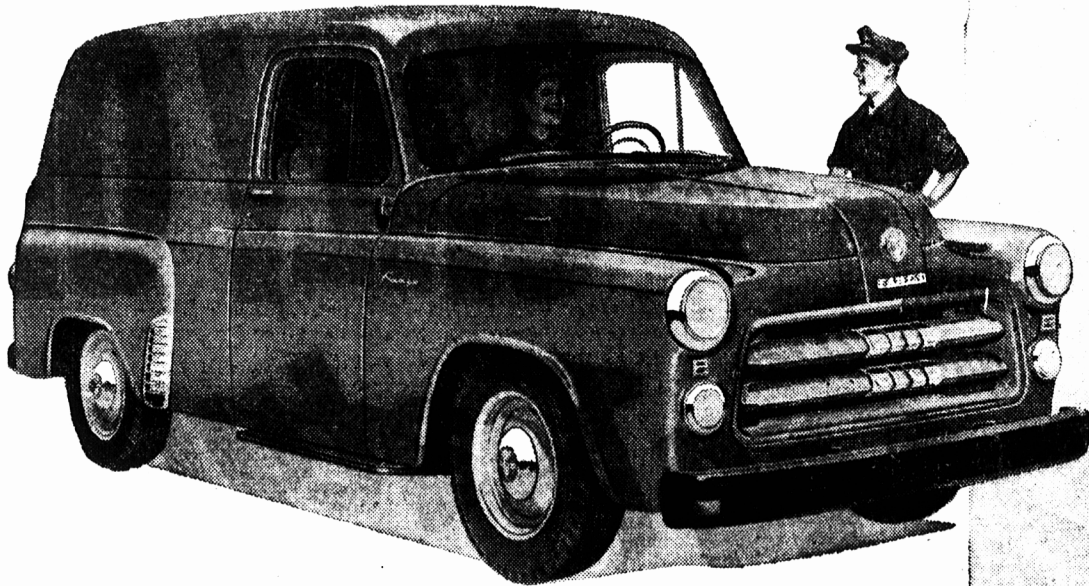

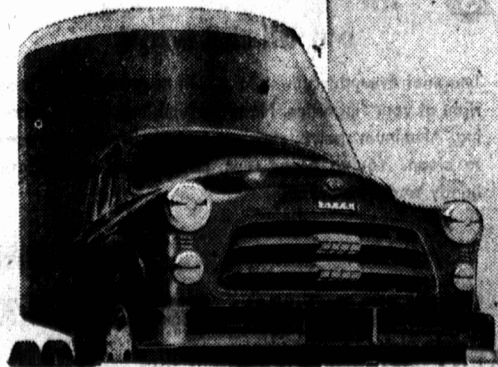
