

Memorial Service For Late Dr. Zella M. Clark

On Sunday, June 23rd, at 8 p.m. a memorial service will be held in the Cavendish Baptist Church, in honor of the late Dr. Zella M. Clark.

Rev. Gordon Carder and Mrs. Carder, returned missionaries from India, will both speak at this service, and Miss Laura Bain, M.A., also returned from India will unveil a plaque that is placed on the wall behind and to the right of the pulpit, corresponding to one on the left, erected some years ago in memory of her sister, the late Martha M. Clark, who served for 35 years in the Telegu Mission in India.

Rev. Bryer Jones, pastor of the Church, will be in charge of the service. The inscription on the plaque reads as follows:

"In loving memory of Zella M. Clark, M.D., who united with this

church June 21st, 1891, and for 37 years served her Master as a Medical Missionary to the Telegus of India.

Entered into rest Jan. 20th, 1957 "Seek ye first the Kingdom of God."

"Go ye therefore and teach all nations."

The following article on the late Dr. Clark is reproduced from the March, 1957 edition of the magazine "Tidings." It was written by Dr. H.S. Hillyer, the General Secretary of the Canadian Baptist Foreign Mission Board.

"On January 20th, 1957, Miss Zella Clark, B.A., M.D., passed away at home in Charlottetown, Prince Edward Island. No one who is acquainted with the history of our Telegu Mission during the last century can fail to remember the devoted and fruitful service of

the Clark sisters, Martha and Zella. Born in Prince Edward Island, in a family distinguished for mission-ary zeal and service, Martha, the older sister, went to India in 1894, and Dr. Zella followed her in 1906 as a missionary of the U.B.W.M.U. The latter is a graduate in Arts at Acadia and in Medicine of Cornell University.

"Her first sphere of labour was the Women's Hospital in Chicacoac and in 1911 she moved to the pioneer field of Sompet, where she founded the medical service which is now so successful, while her sister opened up the women's work in the towns and villages of that great field. In 1936, Dr. Clark, on her return to India from furlough, was again asked to take charge of the "Good Samaritan Hospital," Chicacoac, and this duty she fulfilled until she returned to Canada in 1943 for the furlough which concluded with her retirement on September 30, 1944.

"The Board places on record its gratitude to our Heavenly Father for Dr. Clark's untiring and un-sparing service over so many years for the spiritual and physical heal-

ing of the women and children of India. Many in that day will rise up and call her blessed."

The conference agenda will include reports and discussions on the past, present and future promotion of tourism in the Maritimes, U.S. border relations and the value of tourist service clinics.

Mr. Fisher will report on the cross-Canada activities during the past year, at the luncheon, and a review of the organization's head office operations will be presented

by R.W. Kelly, organizing secretary. Successful regional meetings of this nature have been held this year in Western Canada, Toronto, Montreal and New York. The meeting is expected to be of special interest to the Maritimes which are becoming increasingly aware of the importance of tourism to their economy. "With increased recognition and development, tourism could easily become one of the biggest industries in the Atlantic provinces" states Mr. Fisher.
