## Scottish Professor Conducting Rallies

Special speaker this week and next at Centennial rallies in the Free Church of Scotland in various centres throughout the Islands is Rev. R. A. Finlayson, professor of Theology, Free Church of Scotland College, Edinburgh.

Prof. Finlayson spoke at the Free Church of Scotland at Coleman Friday evening, to open the series of rallies.

Next week he speaks Tuesday evening at DeSable, Wednesday evening in Charlottetown and Thursday night at Murray River.

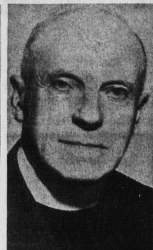
All the services will be held at 8 p.m.

Prof. Finlayson is a veteran of the First World War in which he was wounded. He graduated with an MA degree from Aberdeen University following the war.

Following graduation he took the theological training in Edinburgh Free Church College. He held two pastorates, the first in the Highlands and the second in Glasgow.

He was a chaplain in the Territorial Army (Reserve Army) between the two wars. He was a chaplain in the regular army during the Second War, and was promoted to the rank of deputy-assistant chaplain general.

He has spoken at various rallies, conventions and student organizations in Great Britain.

## Certified Seed Potato Acreage Reported Down

Figures released from the Charlottetown seed certification office show that 3,500 fewer acres of seed potatoes have passed inspection by the federal department of agriculture this year in comparison with last year. This year's figure stands at 23,778 acres; last year 27,003 acres were approved.

This year 16,294 acres of Sebago variety were approved, with 20,711 last year; 4,191 acres of Keeneland, 5,697 last year; Irish Cobblers, 1,611 with 1,190 last year.

Sixteen other varieties were planted in the province, including Green Mountain, 714 acres; Cherokee, 212; Katahdin, 259; Hunter, 135; Keweenaw, 98; Avon, 71; Nottel Gem, 55; Fandy, 30; Warba, 33; Pungo, 44; R. d. Pontiac, 19; McIntyre, 15; Ararat Victory, 3; Calypso, 1; Norland, one quarter acre, and Canso, one quarter acre.

## Fish Firm Leaves N.S. For Quebec

HALIFAX (CP) - R. O. B. Jones and Whitman Limited, one of the oldest fish-wholesaling and general merchandising firms in Canada has moved its head office to Paspébe, Que., from Halifax.

The move coincided with the retirement of P. L. Whitman, who has been president for 12 years, and secretary-treasurer M. R. Lownds, who joined the firm in 1904.

The firm founded late in the 17th century has 12 branches in the Quebec's Gaspé and two in Nova Scotia, at Inverness and Cheticamp.
