Rescind Plan To Sell Land For School Site

A motion that the Montague Community Welfare League grounds be left open for future possible use as a park, and that it should not be sold for less than \$100,000, was carried on a divided vote at a special meeting of the executive of the league yesterday. The motion was moved by Mr. Walter Beer, and seconded by Mr. C. R. Boehner. A previous motion by Hon. Keir Clark, M. L. A., that the land be reserved for a new school for the sum of \$1.00 was not seconded.

The meeting was a follow-up of a general meeting of the league held last week at which it was decided by a majority vote to sell sufficient grounds of the north portion of the league field as a school site. The price to be charged for this area of land was left in the hands of the executive, who were to meet with the School Board on the size of land required.

The motion passed at the special meeting yesterday, however, practically nullifies the action taken at the general meeting, and unless negotiations can be carried on further, it could result in a new site having to be chosen by the board. It is possible, however, that the two boards will get together to find some practical solution to the problem, and thereby to the greater problem of providing classrooms for the presently overcrowded school. It was the expectation that the new school would be ready for the fall term.
