Potato blight appears to be particularly active at the present time and the current wet weather offers no relief. Officials of the Fruit and Vegetable Department of the Federal Department of Agriculture, stated. The belief was expressed that if growers would refrain from digging for a while it might help the situation by preventing the mixing of potatoes. 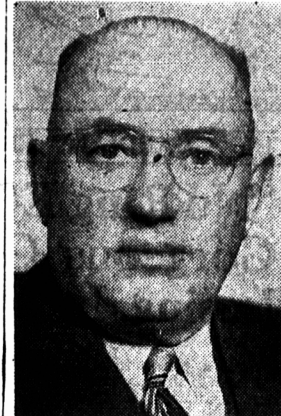
