Local and Other Items.

THE ROPED AREA.—The Byers-O'Brien fight at the North Shore, Lynn, Mass., on Monday night was not allowed to proceed. The police interfered.

THE HAMILL CASE.—James Hamill, under arrest at Shediac for the murder of his brother, has been discharged from custody. The magistrate held that the evidence did not warrant trying Hamill for murder.

SAD DROWNING ACCIDENT.—A St. John despatch says: About seven o'clock on Wednesday evening Harold Stewart Wilson, son of Havelock Wilson, of Strait Shore, was missed from home. Search was made for the boy everywhere. The little fellow's hat was found in a boat and late at night the body was found in about three feet of water. The little fellow had evidently been playing around the boats and fell in. The boy was four years of age.

BAD STATE OF AFFAIRS.—Owing to the heavy ice flows on the north coast of Newfoundland that section has been blockaded for weeks past. Vessels laden with provisions have been unable to reach there, and the people are almost destitute, having used all the winter's supplies. This condition of things is unprecedented in the history of the colony. The government is sending a sealing steamer laden with provisions to supply the needs of the resident population there.

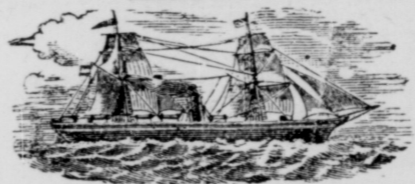
