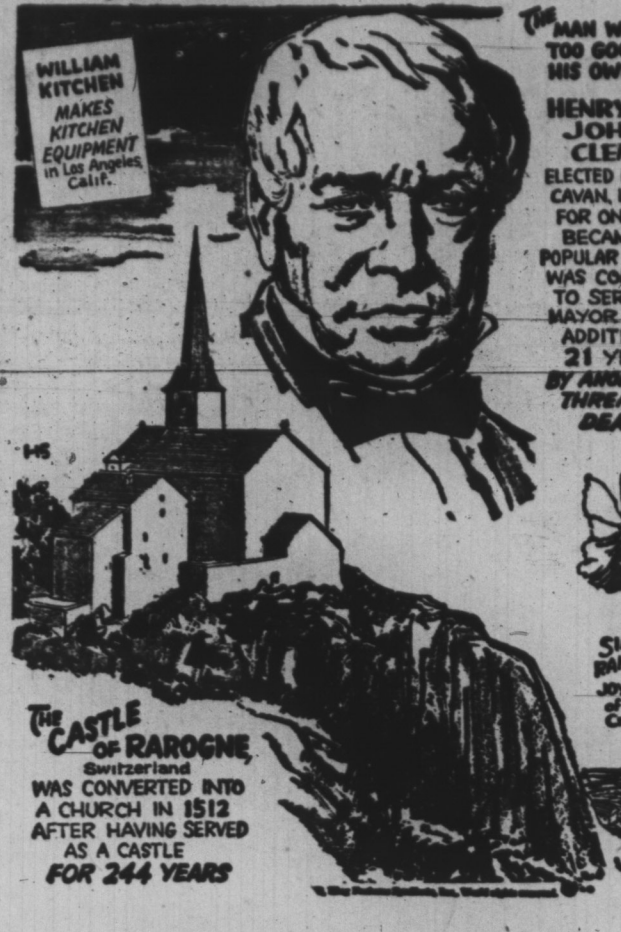

Opening lead—King of spades. It is by no means rare for declarer to survey the dummy after the opening lead is made and discover he is on the verge of defeat. As a matter of fact, I know a great many overbidders who seem to have this reaction all the time. But since everyone at one time or another has encountered this situation, it may not be amiss to point out, as we have many times before, that the declarer is duty-bound to approach the play of such hands not with an attitude of defeatism, but rather in an imaginative frame of mind that genuinely seeks a way out.

Navy Investigations Go On As Ship's Officer Is Fined

By DON HOYT Canadian Press Staff Writer HALIFAX (CP)—Investigation into disappearances of money and supplies from ships and establishments of the Navy's Atlantic Command continued Wednesday. The inquiries are the most extensive since 1955. A navy spokesman said the latest investigation aboard the frigate Outremont involved a quantity of liquor which vanished from the ship. An RCMP official later said Lieutenant H. J. Stuart of Victoria, supply officer aboard the Outremont, appeared Tuesday before a civilian judge on a smuggling charge involving liquor. He was fined \$100. A seaman from the Outremont is being held "in naval protective custody" pending completion of the frigate inquiry, being conducted by the RCMP and Halifax city police.
