**Wants To Forget She Ever Knew Ex - Dictator**

BUENOS AIRES (AP)—If Juan Peron returns in amnesty to Argentina, he won't find little Nelly Rivas waiting for him.

For one thing, little Nelly, his former school girl mistress, isn't little any more. For another, she has plans that don't include the exiled dictator.

Now a well rounded 19, Nelly recently announced her engagement to Carlos Ramil, 24, a clerk in the accounting department of the U.S. Embassy here.

"All I want is to be left alone," said Nelly in an interview. "I want to be like any other girl and lead a normal life. I've been dragged through the dirt and think I've paid my debt to society with all the unhappiness that has been heaped upon me.

"For me, the whole episode is over."

**LOVE AND LUXURY**

Nelly was only 13 when Peron turned Latin lover in the winter of his tottering career and picked her from among a group of school girls to be his mistress.

For two years, until his downfall in the 1955 revolution, the dictator showered her with love and luxury. The November-May romance shocked a nation that still revered the memory of the blonde Evita, Peron's late wife.

When the end came with Peron's exile, Nelly was clapped into an orphanage by court decree and left with her memories. That plus \$200,000 in cash and jewels.

After a few months, Nelly was released from the institution, only to find bitterness and social ostracism waiting on the outside. The scandal of her Peron-day activities continued to pursue her and her family. Her mother was attacked on the street by a group of women who sheared off her hair, the ancient female revenge against moral outrage.

**CASHED IN**

But Nelly made the best of a bad situation, cashing in on her notoriety by selling articles and photographs to newspapers and magazines.

Up until a year ago, she refused to think of marriage. Her standard answer to what became a standard question: "I'm too bitter to think of that for several years." Then along came Carlos, and Nelly began to yearn for the simple, unpublicized life of a housewife.

Keeping a campaign promise that brought him an estimated 1,500,000 Peronist votes, President Arturo Frondizi two weeks ago signed an amnesty law for all political offenders, including Peron and his followers. The law, however, still leaves it up to the courts to decide whether Peron can return from exile.

**NO BITTERNESS**

Whether Peron returns or not, Nelly has no bitterness against him. She denies having been victimized by the dictator and has built up a wall of resistance against the lingering scandal.

UNITED NATIONS, N.Y. (AP) — Sweden proposed Tuesday night that the United Nations Security Council urgently dispatch a watchdog commission to strict-torn Lebanon to guard against outside aid to Lebanese rebels.

Britain and the United States endorsed the proposal and called for immediate action by the council. Lebanon has accused the United Arab Republic of "massive interference" in its internal affairs. The UAR has denied it.

The Soviet Union, which could

kill the proposal by a veto, said it would need at least 24 hours to consult with Moscow.

**Don't Expect Too Much From Public Works, View**

OTTAWA (CP) — The trade department's economic adviser suggests it would take a break with tradition and the erection of a vast administrative machine to try to cure unemployment and recession through a program of expanded public works.

Dr. O. J. Firestone reached that conclusion in completing one of the most comprehensive historical analyses ever made of the Canadian economy. His analysis, pointing up some of the spectacular developments since Confederation, has just been published in London, England, under the title, Canada's Economic Development, 1867-1953.

It makes no reference to the Progressive Conservative government's present drive to fight recession through public works and in fact deals with trends only up to 1953 when the Liberals were in power. But some of the conclusions drawn by the 45-year-old economist may have implications in the current situation.

Over the years, said Dr. Firestone, governments have tended to place declining proportions of their over-all spending in public investment programs. The average for all levels of government dropped to 15 per cent in the 1950-53 period from 20 per cent in 1929.

"These data should be a warning to those who expect great miracles from an expanding public investment program in a period of declining levels of employment and income."

**ECONOMIC IMPACT**

Over the decades, Dr. Firestone found government spending generally had an increasing impact on the economy. But he declined to the view that there has been little evidence of centralization.

"The data on government expenditures on goods and services provide little evidence of centralization. In fact, there is some evidence that the trend is in the opposite direction though it may be reversed in war periods and other emergencies."

**U.S. Tanker Planes Will Fly From Canadian Base**

OTTAWA (CP)—Prime Minister Diefenbaker said Tuesday Canada and the United States soon will sign an agreement providing for operation of refuelling tanker planes from Canadian bases.

The planes are used to refuel in flight bombers of the U.S. Air Force's Strategic Air Command.

Mr. Diefenbaker made the announcement in the Commons during discussion of the Canada-U.S. air defence agreement.

However, it had been known for about a year that work has started on lengthening of runways at Frobisher on Baffin Is-

land and at Fort Churchill, Man., to accommodate the tankers.

He said the agreement will permit establishment of facilities for tankers which would be used continuously in peacetime and be capable of expansion in event of emergency.

The agreement, he said, will be tabled in the Commons.

Later, Opposition Leader Pearson said that insofar as it furthers collective security, he is sure the Liberals will welcome the agreement when it is presented to Parliament.

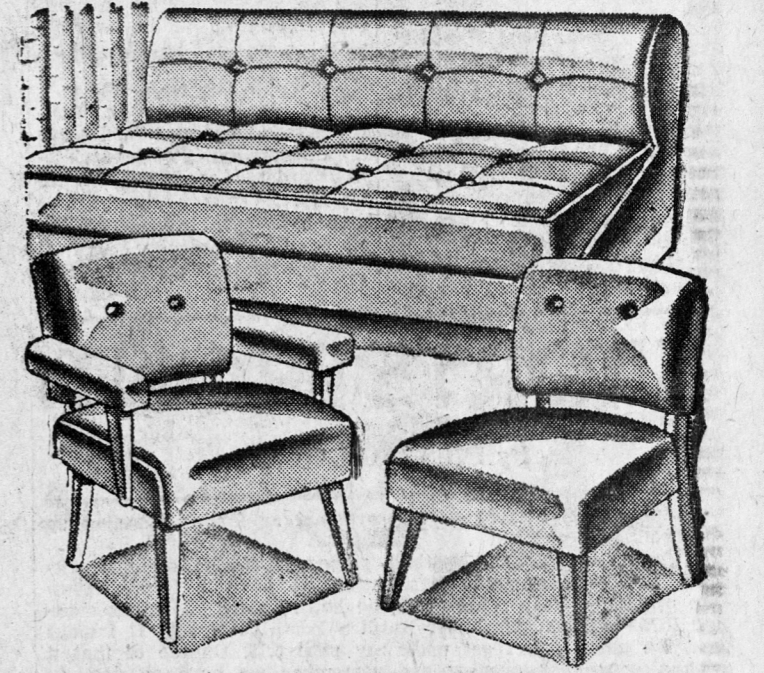
