Problem For Banks

BAIGON (AP) - Slimmering
hostilities between American and
South Vietnamese forces is
impeding joint efforts against
the Viet Cong.

Guerrilla troops of the U.S.
Army's special forces are being
withdrawn from certain
jungle outposts near the
border.

Some Vietnamese unit refused
to provide an armored convoy
for Americans planning to
evacuate wounded mountain
troops.

Racial tension is part of the
problem.

Manufacturing And Mining
Pyramid In Jamaica

Jamaica has set out to break
its links with a history of
dependency, rum and
slaves, pirates and banana
booms.

For a decade, it has sought
to diversify its vulnerable
economy—tropical
agriculture by broadening
manufacturing and cultivating
new bauxite-aluminum oxide
deposits.

On Aug. 6, it struck out as
an independent nation, a free
dominion within the
Commonwealth. It had earlier
severed ties with the West
Indies federation.

In the next decade, it seeks
to double national income and
more than double its
manufacturing industries,
repeating on its own the
accomplishment of the
last decade as a self-governing
colony.

"They're people in a
hurry," said a New York
banker who conducts business
with the new nation.

Whether the new nation can
continue to attract such capital
and use it to develop
self-

hand where we don't attempt

as to the spades, North now
stretched his values a little and
went to three notrump.

This contract would have
gone down one if South had
passed, but South's bid showed
his weakness in diamonds and
resting on the assurance a 13
partner would have four hearts
—since he obviously did not
have four spades—decided to
try four hearts. He was willing
to play hearts with a 4-3 fit.
