MAJOR THREAT
Cowie grew to a major threat six days after it formed far out in the Atlantic. It swept steadily toward the U.S. coastline, curving northward as it advanced.

Hurricane Carol, which formed off Florida last year, travelled in the same direction and smashed ashore Aug. 31 across Long Island and New England, killing 68 persons. Hurricane Edna hit Cape Cod Sept. 1, and then moved over eastern Maine, Nova Scotia and New Brunswick. Twelve persons died.

Hazel, top killer of last year's hurricanes, dived in the Caribbean sea, crossed a narrow strip of land in Haiti and followed the general path Connie now is taking. Hazel struck the North and South Carolina coasts Oct. 15 and swept across most eastern states before winding up in Canada. It killed 145 persons, 82 of them in Ontario, and caused an amount of property damage that never has been fully estimated.

Plucky Father Dogged By Bad Luck In Toronto

TORONTO (CP)—Plucky Mar-timer George Parsons, who hitchhiked to Toronto last May on \$1.50 to arrange a rare monkey-lung heart operation for his daughter, now faces bills and hardship.

His one-year-old daughter, Mona, in whom a heart opening had sealed certain valves, was given emergency 11-minute repairs while a combination of a monkey's lung and a mechanical heart pumped blood through her body.

The operation was successful, the baby is thriving, and the Hospital for Sick Children made medical history. But bad luck dogged the trail of Mr. Parsons who moved his wife and two sons from their hometown of Milton, N.B., after the operation.

July 20, Parsons, sole support of the family, broke his leg. His family has also apparently been abandoned by a hometown fund set up to provide money for heart operations. His hospital and medical bills are due and other expenses are pressing.

106 New Polio Cases Tuesday In New England
BOSTON (AP)—One hundred and six new cases of polio were reported in New England Tuesday, bringing the 1955 total to 1,189. Last year at this time 240 cases were listed in the six-state area.

Massachusetts a girl in reported New England's heaviest toll. The state health department reported 88 new cases, but a health official said the figure was below what had been expected.

In Milton, Mass., and Providence R.I., second-round Salk polio vaccinations were administered in a series of health department statements that further shots should be deferred until after the height of the polio season, because of increased danger of contracting the disease during the current outbreak.

Thirty-one cases of polio have been reported among New England recipients of the vaccine.

None of those inoculated have been among the area's 34 polio fatalities.

CHICAGO (AP)—A Chicago housewife who set out to lose 85 pounds to keep her marriage intact is beginning to lose more ground than weight and she has accused her husband of foul tactics.

On May 4, Mrs. Lillian Korzen, 43, weighed 190 pounds and was given, with her husband Michael's permission, until Sept. 28 to regain her trim at marriage weight of 127 pounds.

She asked circuit court Judge Thomas E. Kluczynski Monday to jail her estranged husband who she says is deliberately withholding support money to upset her diet. She claims the \$35-a-week payments are \$175 in arrears.

Her counsel Edwin Podewell, said the lack of money has caused her frustration and the frustration has led her to eat more.

Korzen's counsel, Sol Friedman, denied this and said Mrs. Korzen wasn't keeping up with her weight-reducing schedule. He challenged her to step on the scale but she refused.

The case was continued until Aug. 11.

BOWLING GREEN, Ohio, (AP)—William Martin, 63, and his wife, Louise, 61, left a suicide note in their car, walked onto the railroad tracks, linked arms, and were killed by a speeding express train here Monday night.

Paul Jensen, engineer of the Pennsylvania Railroad's New York bound flyer, the Red Arrow, said he saw the couple step onto the tracks and start walking arm-in-arm away from the speeding train. He said they looked back once, then turned straight ahead and the engine hit them from the back.

Coroner F. A. Visconti said a note found in Martin's car, parked near the tracks, said "we can't stand it any longer." He ruled double suicide.

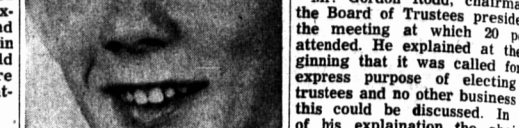
