Dick Sisler Is Dismissed

CINCINNATI, Ohio (AP) Dick Sisler was fired Monday as manager of Cincinnati Reds, apparently because of the club's failure to win the National League pennant.

It was Sisler's first year as a major league manager. The Reds, who were pennant contenders a week before the season ended, finished in fourth place, eight games behind the champion Los Angeles Dodgers.

William O. DeWitt, Reds president, announced Sisler's dismissal, and said: "I feel it is necessary that he be relieved as manager of the Reds."

Sisler, reacted after the announcement, said: "This has been a blow to me. I'm very, very bitterly disappointed for being let out as manager of the Reds."

"I thought I did a good job with the Reds," he added. Sisler, 45, former major league star and son of the horseman's club along with officials and if weather conditions should prove to force a cancellation of this evening's card an announcement will be made early this afternoon.

S. Koufax Ends Fast In Time

LOS ANGELES (AP)—Sandy Koufax, Los Angeles Dodgers pitcher, will end a 24-hour religious fast this week in time to regain his strength before his first appearance in the World Series, a Dodger spokesman said.

Koufax, a 26-game winner, is scheduled to start the second game of the World Series Thursday against Minneapolis Twins.

Dodger manager Walter Alton tabbed Koufax for the second game because the serious opener will be played Wednesday, Oct. 6—a Jewish holiday. Don Drysdale, who won 23, will pitch the opener.

Koufax at sundown Tuesday will begin a fast that will last through Yom Kippur—or Day of Atonement. He will be free to eat at sundown Wednesday.

Andy's Son, a three-year-old standardbred pacer owned by Dartmouth contractors Eric and Harry Webby, has won more than \$18,000 in Maritime harness racing this season and is almost a sure bet to win horse-of-the-year laurels in the Atlantic region.

Even more impressive have been his performances: 24 victories in 26 dashes entered, seven wins in one week, five wins in four days at Truro, bringing his earnings to \$18,346, a healthy figure for this area.

LA's Speed And Pitching Main Reason For Ch'ship

MINNEAPOLIS (AP)—Los Angeles Dodgers have tapped big Don Drysdale to pitch the opening game of the World Series at Metropolitan Stadium here Wednesday against Jim Grant of Minnesota Twins.

Drysdale, a 23-game winner and the right-handed half of the Dodgers' ace pitching Twins, got the call because Wednesday is Yom Kippur, the most solemn Jewish holy day. Sandy Koufax, who is Jewish, will remain out of action.

Dodgers are 13-to-10 favorites here to beat the Twins in the series. In Las Vegas, the National League champions were quoted at 2 to 3.

And it's not likely that Los Angeles manager Walt Alton will change his mind about his starter even if it should rain Wednesday and the opening game be pushed back a day.

"Drysdale hasn't pitched since Thursday and I would not like to have him lay off too long," said Alton.

EXPECT FAIR WEATHER. The latest forecast for the game called for clear weather with temperatures in the lower 70s and no rain in sight.

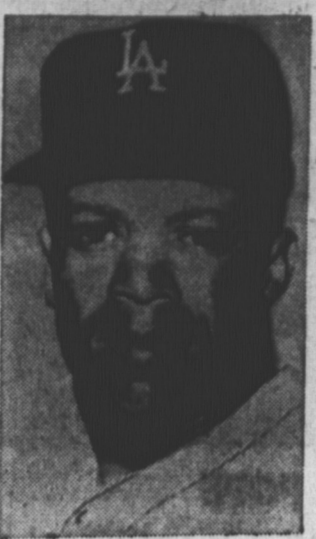
A crowd of about 45,000 is expected for both the Wednesday and Thursday games before the teams shift to Los Angeles and resume their best-of-seven series at Dodger Stadium Saturday.

With the Minneapolis-St. Paul area on central standard time, the first two games will start at 3 p.m. EDT. (4 p.m. ADT) Grant was handed the Twins' opening game assignment ahead of recuperating righthander Camilo Pascual and left-hander Jim Kaat.

He is one of six Twins with 16 or more homers. The Dodgers can boast only two players with as many as a dozen.

But the Dodgers have the edge in pitching with Koufax scheduled to follow Drysdale and Claude Osteen, the other member of the big three, scheduled to open at Los Angeles Saturday. For Minnesota, it'll be Grant, Kaat and Pascual in that order.

The opening day Minnesota lineup will have Don Minick, 22 homers, at first base; Rookie Frank Quilici at second; Harmon Killebrew, 25 homers, at third; Versalles at short; Sandy Valdespino in left field; Jimmy Hall, 20 homers, in center; Tony Oliva, 16 homers, in right; and Earl Battey catching.

Twin's Awesome Offense Faces NL's Top Hurlers

By THE CANADIAN PRESS. On paper, the 1965 World Series shapes up as a contest between the pitching and base-running of Minnesota Twins.

The odd thing about it is the Twins' superiority at the plate in a year in which the National League outshone the American in every hitting category.

Minnesota's team batting average of .254, a league-leading mark, was inferior to that of three National League clubs — Cincinnati, Pittsburgh and Milwaukee — and equalled by St. Louis. But the Dodgers won the pennant hitting a modest .245, which ranked 50th better than seventh in the NL.

The Twins' offensive margin over the Dodgers carries across the board. They have a 774-608 edge in runs scored and 711-548 in runs batted in, in home runs their output almost doubles that of Los Angeles — 150 to 76 — and the edge in hits is 1,966 to 1,529.

On a man-to-man basis the issue is clouded by the Twins' policy of platooning in left and centre field. With Bob Allison and Joe Nousek in the outfield against left-handed pitching, the Dodgers have a 5-3 edge on batting average, although the count is reversed with Sandy Valdespino and Jimmie Hall facing right-handers.

Either way, the Twins are superior at six of the eight positions in runs batted in and at five in home runs.
