OTTAWA, May 23. Sir Leonard Tilley yesterday introduced the supplementary estimates. They include \$2,000 for Victoria Breakwater, Wood Islands. They also include the important sum of \$30,000 which is given to make good to P. E. Island merchants the amount of duties paid into the United States Customs on fish and oils, under arrangements previous to the inauguration of the Washington Treaty, and allowing American fishermen to fish in the Island waters.
