\$14 Million Grain Elevator Is Planned For Port Cartier

QUEBEC (CP)—Building of a \$14,000,000 grain elevator at Port Cartier, Que. on the north shore of the St. Lawrence River has been announced by Premier Jean Lesage. The elevator, to be built by the Louis Dreyfus Corp., a subsidiary of the French Dreyfus Society, is expected to handle some \$200,000,000 worth of grain annually. Construction of the elevator, which will provide employment for 125 persons, is to begin this month and the concrete shell should be completed by December, 1966, Mr. Lesage said. The elevator should be in full operation by the start of the 1968 navigation season. The port will be a trans-shipment point. BBG Plans To Seek Change In Political Broadcast Rules

OTTAWA (CP)—The Board of Broadcast Governors wants the regulation concerning partisan political broadcasts revamped before voting day to end "impossible difficulties" it has brought about. The BBG has announced that it will wash its hands of the ruling as far as municipal elections are concerned until Parliament clarifies it. For provincial and federal elections or byelections, the BBG added, it has made its own interpretation of the rule—that such broadcasts are prohibited for voting day and the preceding 48 hours only for stations with signals going into the affected area. For a federal general election, of course, this would mean every Canadian radio and television station. For a provincial election, it would mean only those stations with signals received within the province. For a federal or provincial byelection, it would lower the restriction to signals going into the specific riding. The board said until the ruling is changed it is not prepared to proceed against any station for "possible breaches in relation to municipal elections." Any private person who believes there has been such a breach remains free to bring an action against a station, the BBG added.

CITE TYPICAL PROBLEMS The type of headaches the rule has given the BBG were pointed up during the campaign for last year's Nov. 8 federal election. A municipal election in Nova Scotia coincided with a visit to the area by New Democrat Leader Douglas on a federal campaign trip. A similar problem arose out west with a municipal vote falling during the federal campaign. Literal interpretation of the amendment or deletion of the section. The regulation reads: "No licensee shall broadcast a program, advertisement or announcement of a partisan political character on any day that an election is held for the election of a member of the House of Commons, the legislature of a province or the council of a municipal corporation, or on the two days immediately preceding any such day." This regulation has been on the books since 1958 and the BBG has been trying for years to get more specific limitations spelled out. Drafting its own interpretation of the ruling appeared to be another move to get government action. The BBG added that it is prepared to advise stations on whether or not they are affected by a ban in any specific election case. If there are any complaints of breaches in connection with federal or provincial elections or byelections, the BBG is prepared to look into them, the announcement said.

Scrap Prices Show Decline

CLEVELAND, Ohio (AP)—Scrap prices plummeted last week at important market centres following a sharp decline in brokers' bids for the April automotive tonnage lists. Steel's composite price on No. 1 heavy melting scrap fell \$2.17 last week to \$32.50 a ton, extending the decline in the market that started several weeks ago. Despite lower prices, mill buying hasn't been stimulated, says the metal-working weekly. "Steelmakers are leaning heavily on their own stocks and heavier supplies of hot metal to support high furnace melts." The magazine says steel consumption in 1966 is expected to top last year's record, and that a first-half shipment record also is likely.

TOPS, EARLIER RECORD Steel consumption this year is expected to range between 95,000,000 and 100,000,000 tons, easily topping last year's record of around 93 million. Demand for steel is so strong, says Steel that some producers have reluctantly pressed marginal blast furnaces and finishing facilities into operation. First-half tonnage movement from domestic mills could be larger than in any comparable period in which demand is not inflated by a strike threat says the magazine. Steel estimates output last week at 2,709,000 net tons, the same as a week before. Production for the first quarter of the year is estimated at 32,777,000 tons, as compared with 35,043,000 in the like 1965 period.

Ships of 100,000 tons displacement can enter Port Cartier, which is open all year because of a compressed air ice-clearing mechanism installed at the port's bottom.
