**BIG CATTLE YARD.**—It is said that western cattle dealers will acquire 200 acres of land in Petite Cote, near Montreal, and will establish a cattle yard there and erect buildings and improvements worth altogether \$100,000.

**GOODS FOR THE YUKON.**—Arrangements are being made for the transit of goods to the Yukon over the White Pass railway in bond. Trains are now running from Skagway to nearly the Canadian border, and as soon as the line reaches Canadian territory a sealed car will be placed on the route to carry Canadian bonded shipments from Skagway across the disputed strip.

**REPORTS DENIED.**—Rev. M. Werner, of the Presbyterian Congo Mission, just arrived in London from the dark continent, has been interviewed on the native uprising in the Congo Free State, and contradicts the reports of cruelty and oppression given out hitherto as the cause of the rebellion. The mutiny, he thinks, is probably the last desperate effort to throw off the white man's control, and nothing but building a railroad is likely to suppress it. "Panic reigns throughout the Congo territory."

**A DISTRESSING ACCIDENT.**—A most distressing accident happened at Brookfield, N. S., last Saturday. Charles B. Tupper, of this place and Mr. Hutt, of Port Medway, were out prospecting for gold four miles from Mr. Tupper's home. While in the act of throwing a plug of dynamite it exploded, blowing Mr. Tupper's leg off near the ankle leaving it hanging by the heel cords only. Mr. Hutt was somewhat stunned by the explosion, but soon recovered and ran for help a half mile. Some forty minutes elapsed before help arrived. Mr. Tupper was conveyed to his home. Doctors Cole and Bentley were promptly on hand and amputated the leg about midway between the ankle and knee.—Halifax Herald.

### CRAPAUD CREAMERY.

The Banner Factory of the Province  
The summary of the business done at the Crapaud creamery from the 1st of June to the 31st of December, 1898, shows a highly commendable advancement in this important and profitable industry. The total number of patrons who furnished milk was 262, an increase of about one hundred over last year. The enormous quantity of 2,877,956 lbs. of milk was handled at the creamery during the seven months. There were manufactured 127,977 pounds of butter which was sold at an average price of 50c, being slightly over 17½ cents (to be precise 17.56) The total amount of money received by this factory was \$22,480.76. This is a splendid showing and worthy the emulation of every other factory on the Island. It may be stated that at the Hampton factory, two miles this side of Crapaud, 380,849 pounds of milk was received last summer, from which \$9,303 3¼ was realized, and at Tryon, only two miles west of Crapaud, factory as that place did business on almost as large a scale as the Crapaud Creamery. These three creameries occupy but a very small area of our country, but the figures just given show what possibilities of profit are attainable by systematic effort and organization.

### Chinese Loan.

LONDON, Feb. 2.—The Times says that the prospectus of the promised five per cent. Chinese railway loan of £2,300,000 will probably be issued at the end of the week by the Hong Kong and Shanghai Bank. The loan will be unconditionally guaranteed by China, and especially secured on the Chinese railways. China has given Great Britain a pledge that these railways will not be alienated to any foreign power.

Lady Majorie Gordon, the only daughter of Lord and Lady Aberdeen, will make her debut this season.

The Sudan campaign, though it has ceased to attract such general attention, is still being vigorously conducted. Within a fortnight the most powerful of the undertaken emirs has surrendered, and the Anglo-British advance has been pushed to El Obeid, the last of the important Derwish strongholds. Kordofan and Darfur, in the western Sudan, are also to be subjected. The Khalifa will not be given time to reorganize his forces, even if he is in a position to persuade any to adhere to his fallen fortunes.
